


2021 AEC Virtual Conference Closes and is available On Demand

Last month the <u>White House announced</u> that it will be redistribut ng \$7.4 billion from the American Rescue Plan to hire and train public health workers in response to COVID-19, which includes \$4.4 billion to state and local governments to expand staf at public health departments, \$3.4 billion to modernize the public health workforce, and a \$400 million investment to launch the Public Health Americorps.
